



Saving the historic sea wall



The Oriental Bay sea wall is a heritage structure protected by Wellington City Council's District Plan. Constructed from mass concrete between 1922 and 1930, it forms the edge to the Oriental Bay Parade. It's a popular promenade, a significant public amenity for recreation and provides a critical route in emergencies.

The condition of the Oriental Bay sea wall has deteriorated over time, so Wellington City Council plans to repair the entire length of the wall from Freyberg Pool to Carlton Gore Road in three stages over a period of years.

Stage 1 involves repairs to the section of the wall between Grass Street and Carlton Gore Road.

From April to September 2021 we'll be filling cracks, removing rusted steel remnants and replacing degraded concrete. This work will extend the life of the century-old sea wall, helping protect Oriental Bay for future generations.
