## **NEW ZEALAND WALKING CONFERENCE, WELLINGTON, 2 – 3 AUGUST 2010**

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### **1. Purpose of Report**

This report provides information on the New Zealand Walking Conference 2010 to be held in Wellington on 2/3 August 2010, and to seek approval for up to two elected members to attend the conference.

### **2. Recommendations**

Officers recommend that the Strategy and Policy Committee:

1. *Receives the information.*
2. *Approves the attendance of up to two elected members at the New Zealand Walking Conference 2010 to be held in Wellington on 2/3 August 2010 and that the costs associated with attending the conference be met from the Elected Members' budget (GVEM01).*
3. *Agrees that should the nominated elected member(s) be unable to attend, they may ask another elected member to attend in their place.*
4. *Notes that there is a Strategy and Policy Committee reserve day on Monday, 2 August 2010, and a Strategy and Policy Committee Pre-Meeting Briefing, Agenda Meeting and an Elected Members Workshop on Tuesday, 3 August 2010.*
5. *Notes that a report back on the conference will be presented to the Strategy and Policy Committee in accordance with Council policy.*

### **3. Discussion**

The 2010 conference is the fourth walking conference and links with the Government's targets for sustainable transport.

The theme of the conference is 'Dollars and Sense of Walking: Creating Liveable Communities' and has been designed to provide opportunities to share research,

experiences, successes, challenges, plans and actions, and to meet others working towards the same goals. Hosted in Wellington, the conference programme incorporates a visit to the top of the Cable Car and will open with the Golden Foot Walking Awards.

### **3.1 Conference Programme**

The programme includes a number of workshops, *walkshops*, plenary sessions and forums.

The conference programme includes presentations from:

- Martin Wedderburn, Principal Transport Planner at Colin Buchanan Consultancy;
- Nigel Cass, General Manager for Tournament Services, Rugby World Cup 2011;
- Steve Abley from Abley Transportation Consultants;
- Julie-Anne Genter, Transportation Planner at McCormack Rankin Cagney Consultants;
- Robin Kearns, School of Environment at the University of Auckland;
- Tracy Allat from Beca Infrastructure; and,
- Andy Smith from Walk Auckland.

In addition to these presentations, the Minister of Transport, Hon Steven Joyce, will also be addressing the conference delegates.

Concurrent workshop sessions of 15 – 30 minutes in length will be looking at a range of walking policy and analysis, design and planning, construction and implementation, and user benefits.

The draft programme for the conference is attached as Appendix One.

### **3.2 Future Conferences**

Conferences scheduled for the remainder of the 2007-10 triennium include:

- Trafinz Annual Conference 2010, Wellington, 5-9 September 2010;
- Resource Management Law Association Annual Conference 2010, Christchurch, 30 September – 2 October 2010.
