- 3. Note that the remuneration framework requires all community board members to be paid an annual salary (i.e. there is no provision for the payment of meeting fees to community board members).
- 3. Agree to recommend to Council that the following salaries be paid to the elected members of the Wellington City Council and the Tawa and Makara/Ohariu Community Boards for the 2012/2013 financial year and that the Council's proposal be referred to the Remuneration Authority for its approval:

- (d) The remuneration proposal will be considered by the Strategy and Policy Committee and the Makara/Ohariu Community Board at their meetings on 19th April 2012.
