Tawa Community Board Monthly Report – September 2005

Safer roads and speed limits

The road safety manager (Paul Barker) will give an oral report at the meeting on September 8.

Petone to Grenada roading link; A roading link from Bing Lucas Drive to Tawa town centre;

Glenside to Tawa walkway along Middleton Road

The city projects manager responsible for the northern growth management framework (John Culliford) will give an oral report at the meeting on September 8.

McLellan Street steps

A dish channel will be installed on the wet side of the McLellan Street steps (which go up to Davidson Crescent from the Main Road) to alleviate the current ground water seepage. This work is programmed to be carried out late August/early September.

Tawa College stream bank work

The Greater Wellington Regional Council report that the stream bank works in the Tawa College land at Duncan Street has been delayed while the work at the pedestrian crossing was completed. However, work on the stream banks is about to begin.

Tawa lookout

Tawa Rotary Club will plant about 50 plants around the Tawa lookout (off Kilkelly Close) in early September. Parks and Gardens are organising for the gate to be moved - this will improve access to the lookout.

Redwood Bush

New track signs will be installed in Redwood Bush once the Friends of Tawa Bush have completed the track from Achilles Close to Peterhouse Street. The signs will be at the three entrances and at the three-way track junction.

Drainage work at Linden railway station

The work at Linden railway station - upgrading 13 metres of existing pipeline, installing a new manhole and upgrading an inlet structure on railway land - will be done by Wellington Pipelines Ltd and is due to start mid September.

George and Maltilda Turkington plaque

Earlier in 2005, Council and the Board were approached by various people to remove the picnic table and seats from the grass area across from the Bank of New Zealand due to anti social behaviour. The table had a plaque affixed to it which commemorated the George and Maltilda Turkington who were the first Mayor and Mayoress of Tawa. The Board are asked to consider a suitable place for the relocation of the plaque.
