



APPENDIX 2

FUNDING POLICY (2001-04) – This document sets out how the services that are provided by Council are paid for. Recreation is funded in such a way as ensure the entire community is provided with opportunities to recreate. The aim is to increase participation and so build the health of the people and the community.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES POLICY (2002) – Outlines the key principles and objectives for providing for Council-owned community facilities (buildings).

SOUTH COAST MANAGEMENT PLAN (2002) – Provides for the effective management of these reserves, focusing on enhancement and protection.

SOCIAL STRATEGY (2001) – Focuses on social capital and community development. Identifies a need for fairer distribution of facilities across the city and supporting communities with low levels of participation and poor quality facilities.

CULTURAL STRATEGY (2001) – Aims to facilitate Wellington's expression of itself – maintaining and developing the city's identity. Key features of the strategy include the city's open spaces and the provision of opportunities for Wellingtonians to participate in sports and recreation.

ARTS STRATEGY (1998) – Aims to promote and strengthen the role of the arts in Wellington's economy and to provide balance between the needs of the social, economic and natural environments. The arts play an important role in the provision of recreation and leisure services.

PLAYGROUND POLICY (2002) – Identifies criteria for future provision and upgrades. Recommends a plan for rationalisation of the playground network.

CAPITAL SPACES (1998) – Sets Council's vision for Wellington's open spaces and identifies ten guiding principles for achieving open space outcomes.

SPORTSFIELD ALLOCATION POLICY (2000) – Identifies an improved allocation system for sportsfields and a fairer system for user-charges.

LEASES POLICY FOR COMMUNITY AND RECREATION

GROUPS (2001) – Identifies new assessment criteria to be used for assessing new applications for lease of Council land and facilities. 'The Wellington City Council has a critical role to play in fostering the well-being and strength of communities. This role includes facilitating community networks, providing recreational opportunities and supporting community facilities'.

OFF-ROAD MOUNTAIN BIKE POLICY (1998) – Aims to increase the variety of mountain biking opportunities on Council reserve land while limiting the conflict with other recreation uses and limiting impacts on the environment.

DRAFT CENTRAL CITY URBAN DESIGN STRATEGY (2003) – Identifies the Central City as 'being a city with events, a 'happening place''.

NORTHERN GROWTH MANAGEMENT PLAN – Identifies the growth of the northern part of the city including support services such as the recreation needs of the new communities.

DRAFT OPEN SPACE ACCESS PLAN (2003) – Aims to develop a classification for all trails as well as track standards for users.

TOWN BELT MANAGEMENT PLAN (1995) – Outlines sport and recreation activities and opportunities on the Town Belt.

LIBRARY STRATEGY (2001) – Identifies how library services contribute to education, information and recreation.

DRAFT TRANSPORT STRATEGY (2003) – Identifies non-motorised transport opportunities.

EVENTS STRATEGY (2003) – Supports local, regional and national events in the city.
