

Special licence (premises)

Note:

- Allow as much time as possible before the date of an event to obtain all appropriate consents. Unopposed special licence applications take a **minimum of 25 working days** to process. Applications received outside of this timeframe may not be determined before the event.
- A building consent may be required before a special licence is issued if you intend to use a building that is not normally used as a licensed premises and/or a marquee or tent is required. This process may take up to 10 working days. For more information about obtaining a building consent, phone 801 3813.
- The building owner has an obligation under the Building Act to ensure that the building is safe and fit for its intended purpose. Please provide confirmation from the building owner that the building is appropriate for this type of function.
- Please note that no more than 12 events or dates can be applied for on this application form.
- Special licences cannot be applied for to remove the designation of a licensed premises.

You are required to provide the following:

Related documents:

- detailed A4 scale** plan of the interior of the premises showing the areas where liquor is to be sold or supplied
- a **written statement from the owner** of the building giving consent to the applicant for liquor to be sold or supplied on the premises and confirmation that the building is appropriate for the type of function being applied for
- a complete list of all food, non-alcohol and low-alcohol beverages that are to be provided
- a copy of each manager's certificate for those nominated to manage the event (if applicable)
- if the event is on a 'Statutory Day' has the District Licensing Agency (DLA)/Police criteria been addressed?

If a private event:

- a copy of the invitation
- a list of all invited guests (full names)

If a public event:

- a copy of the ticket
- a copy of any promotional material for the event

Please note that the applicant must be the party that will be taking the money from the event, eg the name on the bank account. The application is only to be signed by the applicant or the applicant's solicitor NOT an agent.
