Proposal: No stopping, at all times

Information: St Michaels Crescent has a heavy parking demand due to its proximity to

the local shopping village, university amenities and public transportation.

Residents living at numbers 12 and 14 have encountered problems with vehicles parked on the small space between these two properties which then obstructs access to their properties. Council officers have tried to resolve this issue by installing white markings to show the boundary of the vehicle accesses and to give drivers an indication of the size of the available space. Parking wardens have also been involved in enforcing the current parking breaches, however due to the high parking demand the issue hasn't been solved. Residents of number 12 and 14 have also reported abuse from the owners of parked vehicles when they attempt to resolve the issue themselves.

Officers recommend the installation of broken yellow lines to save adjacent residents the constant difficulty in achieving safe access into their properties.
