



# Basin Reserve Trust Report to the Wellington City Council CCO Committee

First Quarter ending 30 September 2021



# 1. Highlights

Quarter One highlights are outlined below:

- Commencement of embankment toilet upgrades and construction of new media facilities
- Execution of agreements with Cello as new Naming Rights Partner for the CELLO Basin Reserve
- Completion of signed agreement with Tui Trademark Licence Agreement for CELLO Basin Reserve Lawn Seed product
- Commencement of NZ Cricket Museum exhibition fitout
- Completion of Junior Rugby and Football winter fixtures

## 2. Statement of Intent KPI Performance

Quarter One is the quietest event delivery period for the Basin Reserve Trust as the ground is transitioned from winter to summer sport and field maintenance is conducted. The table below outlines quarter one actuals vs targets:

#### **Cricket Events and Practise Facility Usage**

During September, the CELLO Basin Reserve was used by the Firebirds for pre-season training sessions. No pre-season games were able to be played due to Covid-19 level changes. From October onwards usage by Cricket Wellington will significantly increase with more teams accessing the practise facilities (following daylight savings).



#### **Other Sports and Community Events**

Junior Rugby and Football completed their seasons at the CELLO Basin Reserve in July, after a delay at the start of the season due to the Peachy Keen concert in April. This activity will commence again in 2022.

#### Functions

Through its contract with Black and Gold Events who manage and promote the Norwood Room and Long Room in the RA Vance Stand as a venue for conferences, meetings, weddings, celebrations, Christmas functions and team building workshops, the BRT is pleased to report that despite the challenges present by COVID-19, 20 functions were held in Quarter One.

### 3. Master Plan Redevelopment

The Trust continues to work with Council in progressing the vision of the Masterplan. Work is now underway to deliver the following projects in the 2021 winter ahead of the 2021-22 season and the Women's Cricket World Cup.

- Media Box
- Embankment toilet upgrades
- In venue Wi-Fi connectivity upgrade
- Northern Entrance upgrade
- Perimeter Fence upgrades

## 4. Fundraising

To date the BRT has secured \$981,000 of fundraising for venue projects. This includes \$30,000 from the International Cricket Council towards the build of the Media Box.

Quarter One reflects a period of minimal activity for the BRT. Expected income was lower than forecasted due to a delay in invoicing for the deposit relating to *Ground Hire Other Events*, which will now be reflected in Quarter Two pending Covid-19. There was additional unbudgeted expenditure of \$19k for a full building wash of the Old Pavilion Stand, RA Vance Stand, Players Pavilion and Groundsmen Cottage. Depreciation was reviewed and rates increased for the assets that been upgraded by Council. Forecasted year-end position is stable, but significant risk remains regarding events and ongoing Covid-19 interruption.
