#### WCCL QUARTERLY REPORT (FY 2021-22 Q4)

Dear Councillors Calvert and Foon,

Below you will find a summary of Q4 performance for Wellington Cable Car Limited (WCCL). It is divided into 5 sections;

### 1. WCCL Q4 results compared to SOI targets

- Q4 saw strong visitation, especially in April were we were blessed with great weather for both Easter and April school holidays. This strong visitation continued through May were passenger numbers exceed SOI budget by more than 10k passengers.
- Revenue was up 7.2% on target for the quarter, and passenger numbers were up 3.8% on target.
- Fare revenue for the full year was \$1,297k, versus budgeted revenue of \$1,838k. This correlates to the Passenger numbers being under budget for the year by 154k passengers.
- YTD cash losses have been funded through a reallocation of asset replacement funds, as per budget.
- WCCL exceeded its reliability targets for Q4



### 2. Operating performance summary

- Visitation for FY 2021-22 was 448k, 154k (-26%) behind SOI budget and 119k (-21%) behind FY 2020-21 actuals
- The graph illustrates Actual passenger numbers from FY 2018-2021, FY 2021-22 SOI, reforecast and actual numbers.



### 3. CAPEX - Middle Tunnel Upper Portal Seismic Strengthening

- WCCL has encountered several delays in obtaining the appropriate permissions / agreements from neighbouring land owners which has delayed the start of the project by close to two months
- Additional costs have been incurred in securing these permissions which have reduced headroom
- The current methodology proposes to see contractors take possession of the site at the beginning of August and anticipated completing work by end of February 2023

- Visitation
  - Work to welcome international visitors, including the first Cruise Ship visitors to Whanganui-a-Tara
- Annual Maintenance Shutdown (AMS)
  - AMS is taking place from 1 11<sup>th</sup> August, with service reopening to the public at 7.30am on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> August 2022
  - $\circ$   $\;$  A replacement bus service will not be in place during the shutdown
  - During the 11-day shut down, we will complete Annual Maintenance on the Cable Car and associated safety systems and start working on critical path elements on the Upper Portal Seismic Strengthening project
- Middle Tunnel Upper Portal Seismic Strengthening
  - Start work and complete all elements which require the Cable Car to be tastionary
- EKOS Carbon Zero
  - WCCL is working on its carbon accounting to achieve Carbon Zero status for FY 21-22
